

# Julia Hull Honorary Citizen Julia Hull Public Library Parade Marshal

Few words have been written of our community library's namesake and this year's Stillman Valley Fall Festival Honorary Citizen, Julia E. Hull (1849-1922). And aside from a lone image and placard hanging in the library building which bears her name, the community has mostly forgotten the progressive, pioneering woman whose passion for learning and generosity has enhanced the lives of thousands of individuals and generations of families over the

past 90 years.

Born on a farm near Byron, Julia
Hull grew to become a woman of
many talents. A teacher, seamstress,
and baker, among other things, she
was also a self-supporting and wellrespected figure of the community. It
was Julia's role as a member of the Stillman Valley Women's Club (formerly the
Wednesday Study Club, est. 1899) that served
as the catalyst for establishing a tradition of library

service within the Stillman Valley community and beyond. Incredibly, Julia and this visionary group of women maintained a library without a physical home by making books available for checkout at local community organizations and businesses. These makeshift libraries included the bank, grocery store, and schoolhouse: a harbinger of the relationship between library and community that would emerge nearly 100 years later.

Julia's dedication to libraries and literacy continued even

after her death in 1922. Her last

will and testament bequeathed the proceeds of the sale of her real estate, personal effects, and "all residue thereof" to the community "for the purchase of good books or to provide a suitable place" for the Stillman Valley library. Julia's dream of a permanent community library was realized just two years after her death, when in 1924, the Village legally established the Julia E. Hull Library. Her home on 122 South Walnut Street was that "suitable place," and it opened with a sizable collection of 1,000 volumes.


While the library has transformed many times over these past 90 years, from building additions, to the advent of computers and Internet, no changes have had such dramatic influence as its transformation from a municipal library into a district library. Prior to this shift, the library served a population of less than 1,000 with a budget that never exceeded \$35,000. In 2000, voters passed a referendum transforming the municipal library into a library district. This new district encompassed the neighboring villages of Davis Junction, Monroe Center and beyond, thereby increasing the library's patronage to nearly 7,000 and its annual budget to approximately \$140,000

within the first year. Following the referendum, the Meridian CUSD 223 approached the newly aligned library district to propose building a joint-use facility which would be physically attached to Stillman Valley High School. And thus, a beautiful, welcoming, modern library was constructed in 2002 at its current location, 100 Library Lane in Stillman Valley. Today, the library houses a collection of over 40,000 materials for loan, and offers nearly 300 public programs annually to a population of 8,277. Notably, the Julia Hull District Library's success as a joint-use facility and its popular programming have been recognized both in books and journal articles nationally and abroad.

It's hard to imagine that Julia could have known her act of generosity would blossom into a legacy that is still alive and growing in size, scope and service to its community. As it turns out, her gift was not simply a home, but also an idea of a place that aims toward, as the library's mission statement directs, "Growing the community mind and connecting people to a world of ideas and opportunities by cultivating conversation, appreciation, creativity, memory and self-awareness." This year we celebrate that legacy 90 years after it all began.

## PARADE ROUTE

The parade route begins by leaving the High School parking lot on South Pine and continues North on Pine Street for five blocks, then going East on Main Street. It continues on Main Street to Meridian Road. The Parade will officially end when it gets past Route 72. The return route to the high school will be along Meridian Road to the east entrance of the high school and back to the parking lot. Groups may stop and disperse at the intersection of Pershing and Meridian.

Due to safety concerns from the officers directing traffic, all parade participants will continue across Route 72 onto Meridian. There will be no stopping at Ks's East End.

If you are in the Parade and going to the High School:

The road in front of the High school is closed for safety reasons. All parade entries that are gathering at the High School should use the back entrance to register for the parade. If you are dropping someone off that is going to participate in the parade, you can park in the back by the baseball fields or drop them off at Highland school. The only traffic past the check-in point will be entries in the parade. Again this is for the safety of all the entries in the parking lot.

There will be food available at the start of the parade route this year. Help support this food booth so we can continue to provide this service on Sunday. Thanks for your cooperation and we hope to see you at the Parade.






nated by our sponsors. 3-D Sound Company will provide music for your listening pleasure. Watch the awards presentation at 3:00 PM to see if your favorite car


